APPEAL OF MR. JAMES RONAN

1	RONAN
2	THE CHAIRMAN: I'd like to open
3	the October 27, 2020 meeting of the
4	Board of Zoning Appeals for the Village
5	of the Branch, 7:30.
6	We have one issue on the docket,
7	and that would be Mr. Ronan, the
8	property at 8 Weatherstone Way.
9	And tonight we have Mr. Jim Ronan
10	to present; correct?
11	MR. RONAN: Yes.
12	THE CHAIRMAN: The floor is yours.
13	MR. RONAN: So good evening,
14	everyone. As you know, my name is
15	James Ronan. I'm a resident of the
16	Village of the Branch.
17	The reason I'm here tonight is I'm
18	seeking a variance to reduce the side
19	yard setback requirement from 25 feet
20	to 15 feet so that I can extend my
21	existing pool/patio and also add a
22	permanent accessory structure adjacent
23	to the pool which should hopefully
2 4	provide some shade to anybody who's out
25	there on a hot summer day, in addition

2	with a fireplace.
3	Like everything else with this
4	pandemic, everybody is retreating to
5	the safety of their homes now.
6	Everybody is spending a lot more time
7	in their backyards, and that's what we
8	did this year.
9	I have two young boys who spent a
10	lot of time in the pool. And grandma
11	and grandpa were over a lot. They're
12	older now. And it disappointed me to
1 3	see them having to go inside and get
1 4	relief from the sun, get into the air
15	conditioning, and seeing the kids'
16	faces when they couldn't rate their
17	dives anymore or their handstands or
1.8	their cannonballs or whatever it was in
19	the pool.
20	So I went out and I bought a bunch
21	of umbrellas, and they all blew away or
22	broke. I got canopies and everything
2.3	else under the sun, and it really just
2 4	didn't work out.
25	So we contacted a couple of

2	landscape designers who came over. And
3	they had great plans, beautiful plans.
4	Cne of the plans is is huge. I
5	mean, it's got everything. You could
6	fit a small family in there the way
7	they have this thing set up. And
8	they're going to pave the entire
9	backyard, take out a lot of trees.
10	And the way it's positioned, as
11	some of you saw, the location is I
12	feel like it's going to be pretty
13	intrusive to the way the neighbors
14	or the lines of the neighbors
15	they'll be able to see it, whereas it
16	would be perfectly within all the
17	zoning regulations and everything like
18	that. But I do like my neighbors and I
19	prefer not to encroach on their
20	lifestyle.
21	So we looked at an alternate
22	solution which needs the variance. And
23	it is the harder of the two solutions,
2 4	being that it was more I mean, we
25	didn't get to use it this year

1	RONAN
2	obviously because we're trying to do
3	the right thing and go for the
4	variance. But that is that is the
5	plan.
6	So what we're trying to do is move
7	it into a location where our neighbors
8	really won't see it, and that is kind
9	of in the back corner as you saw it. I
10	think that's probably the best place.
11	MR. DICK: Mr. Ronan, just a quick
12	question.
13	You said initially you're looking
14	to change the setback from 25 feet to
15	15 feet.
16	Is it 25 or is it 10?
17	MR. RONAN: I don't know how you
18	measure it. But you saw the location.
19	It's 10 feet off of the fence, so
20	however you need to
21	MR. DICK: So you're asking for a
22	variance for to go 10 feet instead
23	of 25 feet? So you're asking for a
24	15-foot variance?
25	MR. RONAN: Yes.

2	MR. DICK: Because you said
3	initially 15 feet you're looking for a
4	variance of or 15 feet from the fence.
5	MR. RONAN: It's 10 feet yeah,
6	10 feet from the fence.
7	MR. DICK: I just wanted to
8	clarify that.
9	THE CHAIRMAN: It's correct in the
10	letter.
11	MR. DICK: Yes.
12	MR. RONAN: Any questions?
13	THE CHAIRMAN: Anything else?
14	MR. RONAN: That's it.
15	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Yeah, we did
16	some hard measurement. And actually it
17	was we roughed it out. It was
18	probably a 14-foot variance, but we're
19	splitting hairs I think at that point.
20	Let's keep it at 15, you know,
21	depending on exactly how you in the
22	event it gets approved you put the
23	layout, a 15-foot variance would
24	ultimately be what you're looking for.
25	Okay. So let's go around. We

2	start with Dennis usually with open
3	comments from the board.
4	MR. BADER: I've been at the
5	location, you know. I was able to take
6	a look at the positioning of it and as
7	far as neighbors in the backyard and
8	everything to that effect. So I think,
9	you know, probably it is the least
LO	intrusive area that you could put it in
1.1	based on the position of the homes to
L2	you.
13	I was wondering about the fire pit
14	and the running will you be running
15	gas into that? Will you be running
L 6	electric into that as well?
17	MR. RONAN: So we're going to
18	run the plan is we're not doing
19	anything in terms of, you know, crazy
20	with the electric. We really we
21	want an outlet to plug in a
22	refrigerator potentially. We want an
23	outlet to have a fan inside. And then
2 4	that's really it. And that power will
25	run off the existing pool panel that we

2	have right now, the way the landscape
3	designer had it planned out.
4	Now, in terms of the fuel for the
5	fireplace, we were going to use just
6	existing wood, just a wood fireplace.
7	If that becomes an issue, we have no
8	problem having gas of some sort, in
9	which case we would I guess then we
10	have to pursue the appropriate permits
11	or whatever it is that we need. But
12	right now, we have no intention of
13	running gas.
14	MR. BADER: What about, like,
15	lighting?
16	MR. RONAN: Lighting, if we do
17	anything it will be small, hockey-puck
18	lighting inside, but I mean we haven't
19	gotten that far because we've been kind
20	of waiting for the variance to get
21	approved before we finalize the
22	lighting.
23	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
24	Anything else?
25	MR. BADER: No, that's all.

10	at this time.

13	Mr. Ronan. We went through the
14	backyard. We looked at the positioning
15	of where he wanted it to go, the
16	positioning of the neighbor's houses.
17	And as he mentioned, he's got two
18	options as to, you know, one without
19	the variance, one the variance. It's
20	seems like the one with the variance is
21	the the more appropriate for his
22	uses.
23	Being that I don't see any of his
24	neighbors in contention for this right
25	now, that's another big thing that, you

2	know, I like to take into
3	consideration.
4	So at this point, are we good to
5	make a motion?
6	THE CHAIRMAN: Yeah.
7	I mean, listening to my fellow
8	board members, I I'm in agreement
9	with them. I know you have young
1.0	children. I know you'd like to keep
11	that other area open, because you
12	certainly could put it there as well.
L3	But potentially you'd lose the use of
L 4	that wonderful open space. And having
15	small children, I'm sure they would
16	enjoy that.
L 7	And, you know, being on this
18	board, we are also residents. And we
9	have to think on two sides of the
20	equation. I think where you're tucking
21	it in is a pliable corner and out of
2.2	sight for the most part. And with a
23	variance that potentially this board
2.4	could grant, I also believe it's
2.5	probably the best location.

2	MR. ROBELEN: We got the slips
3	back?

18	portion.

20	Anybody like to second that
21	motion?
22	MR. ROBELEN: Sure.
23	THE CHAIRMAN: So if someone would
24	like to make a motion, you'll have to
25	state it granting the variance.

4	at 8 Weatherstone Way of 15 feet.
5	THE CHAIRMAN: Anyone second that?
6	MR. BADER: Yes.
7	THE CHAIRMAN: Dennis seconds it.
8	Let's have a vote.
9	All of those in favor of granting
10	the 15-foot motion?
11	(Unanimous vote of the Board.)
12	THE CHAIRMAN: It would be
13	unanimous.
14	Mr. Ronan, your variance has been
15	granted. Good luck with your
16	construction.
17	Keep in mind that you have to go
18	to the building inspector now
19	MR. RONAN: Okay.
20	THE CHAIRMAN: and let him know
21	that the variance was approved at the
22	open the public meeting. And
23	eventually, he'll be able to check the
24	minutes for that. But if he has a
25	question, he can come to me.
